

## **2022 Legislative Priorities**

The Nacogdoches County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors met on December 6, 2022 and approved the following legislative/public policy priorities.

## **TRANSPORTATION:**

- <u>I-69 Initiative</u>: The Chamber must stay engaged to ensure that the project moves forward to benefit Nacogdoches County. This includes:
  - To continue to support and advocate for 1-69 funding on the state and national level
  - Working with TxDot officials and local business leaders to determine what works best for the Nacogdoches County

## **EDUCATION:**

- <u>Stephen F. Austin State University:</u> The Chamber must continue to monitor the transition of Stephen F. Austin State University to the University of Texas System. This includes:
  - Working to ensure that SFA is appropriately funded
  - o That on-campus student enrollment continues to grow
  - That faculty and programs are not reduced in the process of this transition
  - That the local community has a voice in the future of SFA
- **Unfunded Mandates:** The Chamber opposes unfunded mandates for public schools that are not funded by the State

**INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT:** The Chamber supports investment in infrastructure that will result in Nacogdoches County being more attractive for investment.

 Working with local and state officials to determine where resources can be found to minimize the impact on local tax payers **HEALTHCARE:** The Chamber is opposed to any legislative mandates that will increase the cost to employers of providing healthcare benefits to employees.

- The Chamber supports the use of telemedicine to reduce costs and increase access to care
- The Chamber supports increase state funding for mental health services to reduce the impact on the judicial system
  - Too many women and men currently in Nacogdoches county are in need of mental health services and should be treated by out-patient services or in a mental health facility. Currently, there are too little funding available to provide these services.

**ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:** The Chamber should support investments in land and housing to support future economic development

- **Economic Development Sites:** The Chamber supports the identification and acquisition of economic development sites on the I-69 Corridor. This includes:
  - A public/private partnership should be established to identify potential sites for business/industrial sites
  - Resources should be sought to purchase and develop these sites to accommodate future economic development opportunities
  - o The Chamber should lobby Austin legislators for legislation will allow municipalities to annex additional land for future development.
- HOUSING DEVELOPMENT: There is currently a shortage of housing in Nacogdoches. The Chamber should encourage and promote the construction of housing developments at all levels.
