

Years 1940s


1917-1921

1923

First classes held, mascot selected

During campus

by popular vote at
a special student
assembly of faculty
and students.



1924

Vista Drive opens

Since the completion of the Austin Building in 1924, Vista Drive has provided a unique view of the campus.

1935

First homecoming

Homecoming is now an annual fall event featuring a bonfire, two parades and, of course, football.



1944 Experimental Forest

established

The Stephen F. Austin Experimental Forest is established by an act of Congress and measures more than 2,500 acres. It is still in use for recreation, forestry and wildlife management research.

1947 First Lumberjack

Day

Lumberjack Day started by a proclamation of the Student Body President. Students on campus are expected to wear blue jeans, overalls, plaid shirts and boots.

SFA's first renaming

Stephen F. Austin
State Teachers
College renames itself
to Stephen F. Austin
State College. It is
the first of two name
changes — the second
took place in 1969
when SFA became a
university.

Shelton Gym and Mays Hall are constructed to keep up with the post-war boom from returning veterans.

1958

Fine arts gets a home

Ground is broken on the Griffith Fine Arts building.



1960 College Center

1969

SFA becomes a university

A big day in our history as SFA moves up from a college to a full-fledged university.

1972 Homer Bryce Stadium

1970s

constructed

The spirited home field of the SFA Lumberjacks football team is constructed on the northeast side of campus.



1974

Don't look, Ethel!

Dr. Ralph W. Steen allows students to streak on campus for one night, March 6, 1974, without repercussions.



1979

Axe 'em, Jacks hand sign created

Thanks to the school spirit of a small group of creative SFA cheerleaders, the university now has its own signature hand sign.



1983 "Surfin' Steve" fountain installed

Due to a dramatic stance and flowing water, this iconic statue of Stephen F. Austin is affectionately nicknamed "Surfin' Steve."

1984 Observatory addition

SFA physics and astronomy faculty members design and construct what was then and is still the largest student telescope on a Texas university campus, measuring 41 inches.

1985

Putting down roots

The Mast Arboretum begins as a project of SFA's first landscape plant materials class. Since then, it has gained a reputation for its diverse collection of plants and its dedication to conservation, education and research.

1985 Hall 20

Opening in fall of 1985, Hall 20 is the first co-ed dorm on campus.

1989

Athletics nationally ranked

Lumberjack football team is ranked number one in the nation for the first time.

1992

Coliseum renamed

The coliseum is renamed to William R. Johnson Coliseum in recognition of former president's efforts to advance athletics.

1993 Student volunteerism gets a boost

As part of the university's 70th anniversary, SFA's First Sweat Equity Day is established, leading to a tradition of SFA involvement in community assistance projects.

1995 Ol' Cotton makes some noise

The university and its military science department purchase Ol' Cotton, the cannon fired at SFA football games, to help promote school spirit.

1997 Registration moves online

Every office on campus now has its own website, and inperson paper-based course registration moves out of the Norton HPE Complex and onto the internet.

1997 First permanent endowment created

The campaign
"Share the Legacy"
gives the university
its first permanent
endowment.
Approximately 3,500
alumni and private
donors give more than
\$37 million to aid the
university in serving
the educational needs
of East Texas.



1997 In bloom

Work on the eight-acre Ruby Mize Azalea Garden begins.

2001

Focus on diversity

Under Dr. Tito Guerrero, the university's seventh president, enrollment pressures lessen as diversity increases and more African-American, Hispanic and international students enter the institution than ever before.

2007 Baker Pattillo becomes president

The board of regents names the first alumnus to serve as president – Dr. Baker Pattillo, a veteran SFA administrator for more than 40 years.

2010

Garner Apartments demolished

What was once the tallest building in town is razed to make way for Lumberjack Landing.



2018 STEM Building

\$46.4 million Ed and Gwen Cole STEM Building officially opens, and students begin learning in its state-ofthe-art classrooms, labs and collaborative work spaces.



2019 SFA beats Duke at home

Duke, ranked #1 in the nation, had not lost at home to a non-conference opponent in 150 games.



2021 Basketball facility expansion

Loddie Naymola Basketball Performance Center is completed.

Board of Trustees votes to join the University of Texas system.
